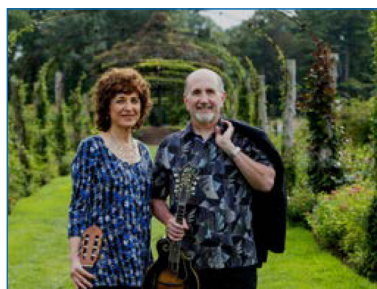


THE GLORIA McLELLAN SILENT ART AUCTION

ACCEPTANCE

Deadline to remit your information is **JULY 15, 2023**, if you would like to listed in our Festival brochure.

PAYMENT

CANCELLATIONS

Refunds will **NOT** be given for last minute cancellations or no shows. No refunds will be given for accidents, weather or health. The Festival will go on rain or shine.

SET-UP

Set up may begin on Friday, August 25th at 8:00 a.m. No breakdown before 4 P.M. on Sunday, August 27th. Your space will have an exhibitor number that corresponds with our Festival brochure. In order to create uniformity, artists and artisans are asked to use black table coverings. Dollar Store plastic is acceptable.

OVERNIGHT

There **WILL NOT** be any overnight security. It is recommended that artists remove their valuable items overnight. It is recommended that tents be lowered on Saturday evening in case of wind or rain. All tents must be weighted down.
